



Since 2007, our mission has been to create an environment where girls thrive. With 90% of our girls in college or university and no attrition due to pregnancy, we've been doing just that.

In Muhuru Bay, Kenya, girls regularly drop out of school due to pregnancy, child marriage, lack of sanitary pads, gender-based violence, or the death of their parents due to HIV/AIDS. The very few girls that avoid these challenges and finish school lack funds for higher education and are not academically competitive for college acceptance.

That's where WISER comes in.

At the WISER secondary school, we provide fully-funded education, clothes, safe housing, leadership training, reproductive health education, meals, and essential medicines to 150 students every year. WISER also hosts on-campus community health events, houses a sustainable garden for agricultural outreach, and provides 5,000 community members with clean water.

We believe that educating a girl has dramatic health and economic benefits for her, her family, the community, and the world. But don't take our word for it. Research from around the world supports girls' education as a powerful factor in reducing infant mortality, reducing HIV risk, improving wage-earning power, and developing communities.

In short, we believe that exceptional young women can lead change in their communities, and we create an environment in which the girls of Muhuru Bay, Kenya become exceptional leaders.



Education at WISER

90% of WISER alumni each year attend a college or university.
100% of our students finish high school.

WISER currently ranks in the top 1% of all 360 schools in its county and is the #1 Girls School in the region.

Despite the 70% dropout rate in neighboring schools, no WISER Girl has ever left before finishing school.

Community Health at WISER

WISER's sexual and reproductive health outreach has trained over 200 youth through peer education.

WISER distributes sanitary pads to 400 girls each year and provides HIV counselling to all students.

Our water system is the only clean source of drinking water for 5,000 people in the community.
